GE HEALTHCARE TO BUY CLARIENT FOR \$580M

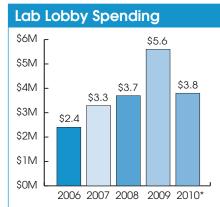
GE Healthcare (United Kingdom), a unit of General Electric, has agreed to buy Clarient Inc. (Aliso Viejo, CA) for approximately \$580 million in cash. The deal, which is expected to close in early December, values Clarient at FIVE times its current annualized revenue of \$115 million. *Continued on page 3*.

SONIC TO BUY CBLPATH FOR \$123.5 MILLION

A ustralia-based Sonic Healthcare Ltd. is buying CBLPath Inc. (Rye Brook, NY) for \$123.5 million. The deal, which is expected to close in December, values CBLPath at approximately 1.5 times its estimated annual revenue of \$85 million. *Continued on page 2.*

LAB LOBBY SPENDING TARGETS IN-OFFICE LABS AND REGULATION OF LDTs

Ten lab and pathology trade groups and companies have spent \$3.8 million on lobbying politicians so far this year, according to data collected from the Center for Responsive Politics. In total, the 10 lab organizations employ more than 60 lobbyists who work to influence healthcare policy decision-makers in government. In particular, trade groups want more regulation of in-office histology labs at physician offices, and limited FDA regulation of laboratory-developed (aka homebrew) tests. *Continued on pages 5-7*.
